### 1. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- a. Staff In-service Day-Thank you to the following who made presentations:
  - Alicia Schofield SMARTBoard demonstration
  - Karen Gress Direct Instruction
  - Marlene Mongolo and Heidi Bethke Response to Intervention
- b. Inspection took place on September 5, 2012 of the Loyalton High School roof. Present were the engineer from Nichols, Melburg & Rosetto, the inspector from the Division of State Architects, Rose Asquith (S-PJUSD Business Manager), Kevin Nolen (CRM Group), Toribio Ramirez (Maintenance, LHS), Mike Moore, Todd York (Board Members) and Stan Hardeman (Superintendent).

The top layer was removed revealing saturated sections and dry plywood; four layers of the roof have deteriorated. The basic infrastructure of the roof does not seem to be damaged. YORK inspected the roof and remarked that when he stood on the edge of the roof water seeped out. He asked if the cost of the exploration will be higher since we discovered that there are four layers of roof.

Mr. Hardeman responded that they had four areas marked to inspect but limited it to two because of the cost, so it will remain close to the originally estimated cost.

Mr. Hardeman reminded the board that at first OPSC had recommended a roof with a slope and have since commented that there is a basic design flaw with the roof. A more significant slope needs to be added, which would raise the cost of the project to around 4.3 million. Now they say to stay with the conceptual.

WRIGHT suggested investigating the possibility of a solar roof and applying for Federal grant monies.

Mr. Hardeman stated that to deal with the problems of the roof during this coming winter spot patching will continue.

YORK commented that the original workmanship showed seams going in the wrong direction and little or no lappage. It was reported that the original, new roof leaked two years after it was built.

MOORE reminded the public that if the cost of repairing the school is over 50% of what it would cost to build a new school, we may get funding to build a new school but it would only consist of 4.7 classrooms and a multipurpose room.

DRYDEN commented that the state inspector was examining the roof at the same time class was in session, therefore witnessing our students dealing with this situation at their school. Mr. Hardeman thanked Rose Asquith for her work with OPSC and the CDE Oversight, who will write a letter on our behalf, and also to Sharon for initially contacting Senator Ted Gaines' office for his support.

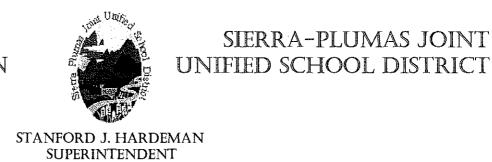
