# 2016 History/Social Science

A New Framework

## Background

- The Standards
  - Essentially the same scope and sequence as the original 1998 standards with a few updates in content.
  - To adopt new standards and practices, the State Board of Education would have to pass a law to do so, but has yet to act.
  - In order to update content to connect to 21st Century issues and contexts, there have been two framework adoptions since 1998.
     One in 2005 and one in 2016.

## What's New

- The integration of both the Common Core (adopted in 2010) and English Language Development Standards (adopted in 2012).
- Aligned with the C3 Framework: College, Career, and Civic Engagement.
- Laws passed since the last Framework was adopted that require us to either add new content, or expand what was already there. Substantive new content about the history of LGBTQ citizens, Filipino-American contributions in WWII, and the Armenian Genocide.
- Mandate from the State Board of Education to update the document to reflect "current and confirmed research." Updated historical research.
- The new Framework emphasizes the development of student content knowledge, discipline-specific inquiry, student literacy, and citizenship.

### Instructional Shifts

- Discipline-specific Inquiry.
  - Encourages teachers to organize their instruction around questions of significance for students to explore and, after analyzing relevant evidence, develop their own interpretations.
    - For example, in the 9th grade elective chapter, in the section on California history, students are asked to consider demographic and economic data in order to investigate the state's population growth in the mid-20th Century: "Why did California attract new residents? What could it offer to them?"
