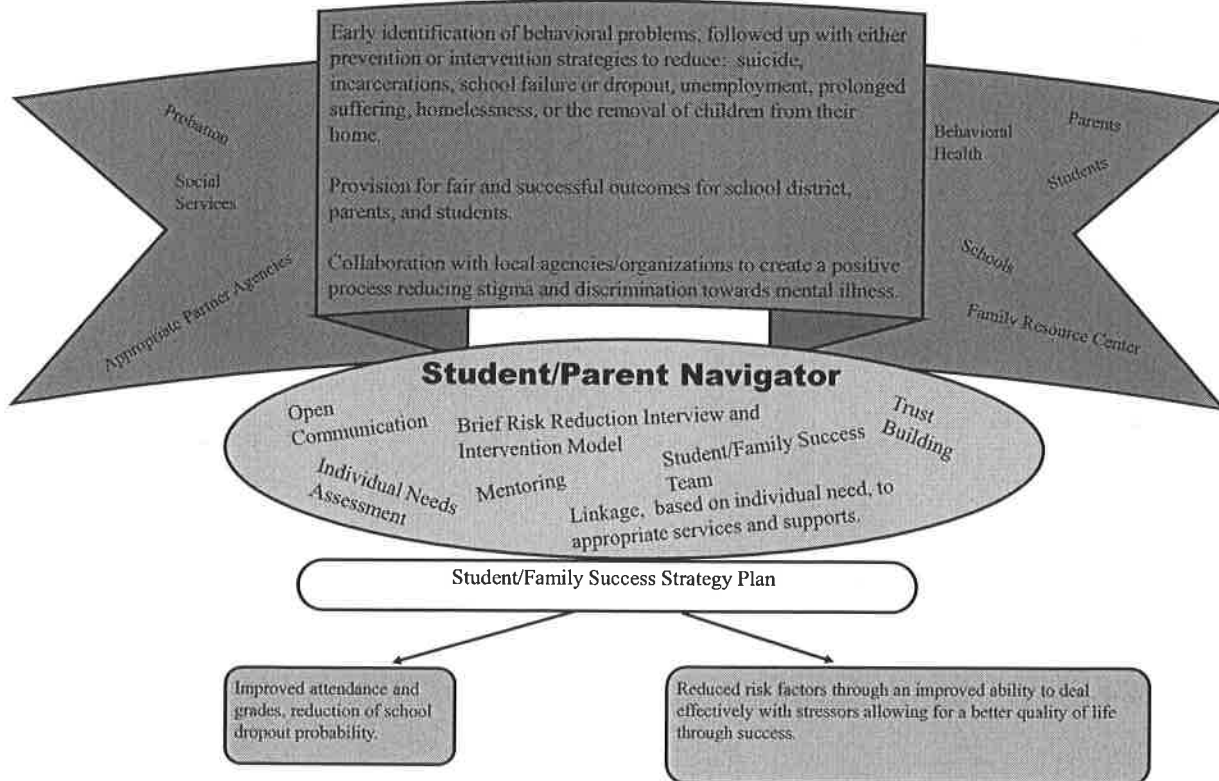

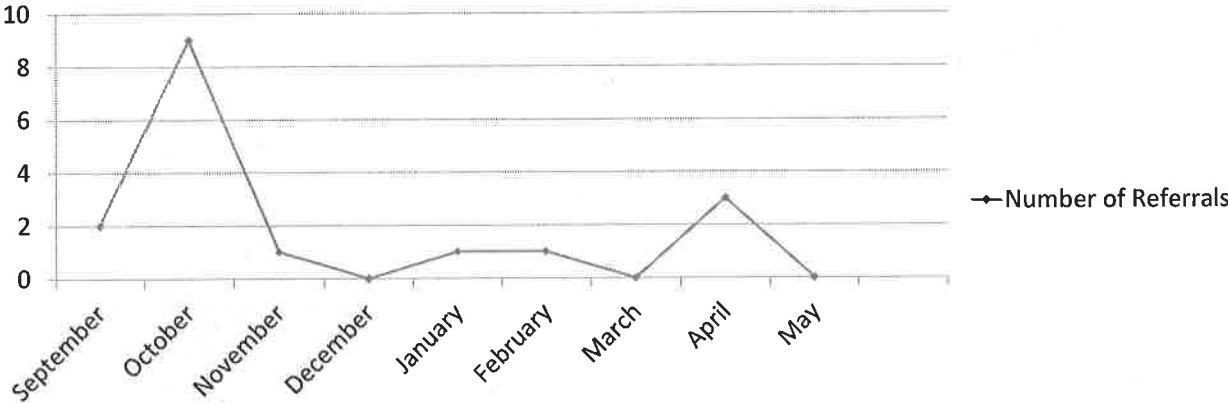

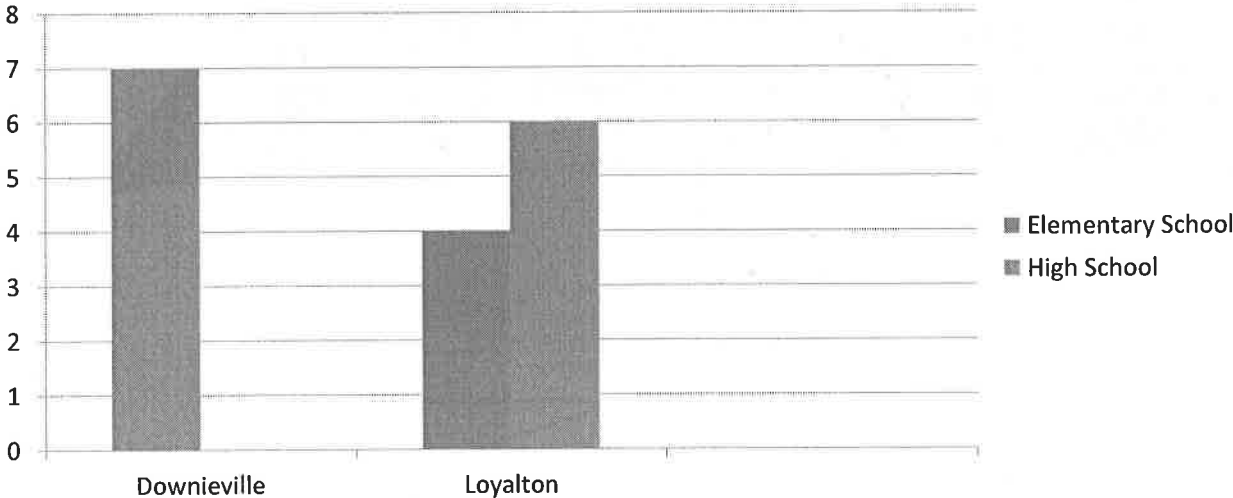
SPN Referrals 2017-2018

N=17 referrals



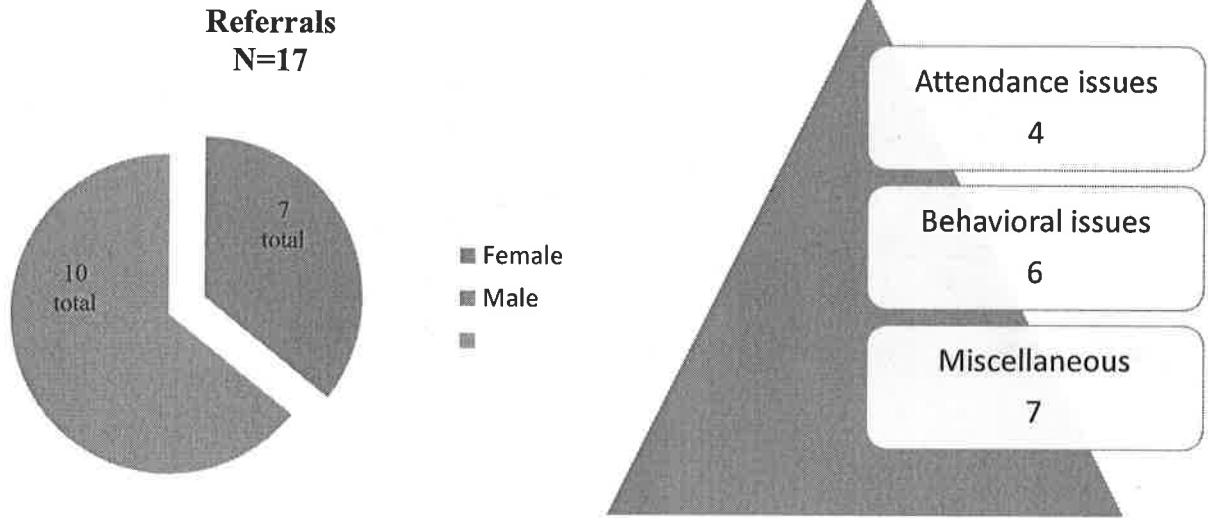
SPN Demographics 2017-2018

In Conclusion:

On average, the SARB watchlist contained 20 students. With 17 referrals (10 on the watchlist and 7 pre-sarb), the Student Parent Navigator engaged 85% of the students on the watchlist.

88% of the referrals had successful outcomes or continue to have ongoing engagement.

Outcomes not met (12%) were due to parents inability to respond to outreach efforts

Student Parent Navigator hopes that this data shows the successes this 2017-2018 school year, as well as identify any needs to be addressed next year.
